5. With explicit instruction in structured literacy, dyslexics can be taught to read well.

Children with dyslexia can learn to read, and learn to read well when given the right kind of teaching. Failing to identify those children with dyslexia, and provide intervention early, damages children's self-esteem. Many dyslexic children who are struggling in school suffer from low self-confidence, affecting their mental health. Dyslexic children may also be bullied by classmates who do not understand or respect their differences.
