Year 5	Unit 13 - Quel temps fait-il? (What's the weather like?) This unit focuses on correct pronunciation of vowel sounds (particularly the 'oh' sound). Children will learn how to talk about the weather and where people go in different conditions. They will use this knowledge to present a weather report to their peers, developing their speaking skills.	Unit 15 - Quelle heure estil? (What time is it?) This unit revises numbers to 60 in order for children to tell the time in French (digital and analogue). Children's listening skills will be assessed in this unit.	Unit 17 - Les coquelicots (a painting by Claude Monet) This unit revises colours and progresses to detail how colours are placed after the noun they are describing in French (as opposed to before the noun in English).
